HB 30

Feminine Hygiene Legislation



HB 30: REQUIRE CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES SUPPLY FEMININE HYGIENE PRODUCTS

This bill will: "require municipal and county correctional facilities and state correctional institutions to provide inmates experiencing a menstrual cycle with an adequate supply of feminine hygiene products."

- Ensures multiple sizes of products, as needed, at no cost
- Requires access to shower during cycle regardless of security level
- Requires hygenic storage and containers for disposals

"Hygiene is so hard to maintain while locked up if you don't have money."


