I do know, that as a kid, it seemed like that "common table" solved a lot of problems, offered a lot of understanding, and everyone knew your name. The next time I find myself in a restaurant I am going to reach deep down within myself and find the confidence to sit at the common table. Perhaps that is where life-changing, soul-rattling, and grace-filled conversations are happening.

If we can't find it in a church, maybe we can find it in a restaurant. Better yet, maybe the church can step up and model a "common table" for the world today.

Property claims have increased dramatically due to fires, floods, hurricanes, tornadoes, windstorms, hail storms and so on. As a result, insurers are taking significant steps to manage their risk.

- · Be prepared for your property insurance to increase more than usual when your policy is renewed.
- · Don't be surprised if your insurance company does not offer a renewal at any price.
- Be sure to purchase sufficient liability coverage. You may rarely or never make a claim under your liability policy. If you do, it's likely to be significant.

Alan was born in Hamilton, Ohio to Carl and Phyllis Sippel, and from his early years, developed a passion for art, instilled in him by his beloved mother, a practicing artist and art teacher. Alan went on to attend and graduate from Ohio Wesleyan University in 1967 with a degree in Speech and a minor in Fine Arts and then completed his graduate work at Miami University. After being an art teacher for a short time, Alan was called to serve in the ministry and attended the United Theological Seminary in Dayton for his training. Rev. Adam Hamilton is the founding pastor of The United Methodist Church of the Resurrection in Leawood, Kansas, one of the fastest growing, most highly visible churches in the country. Resurrection is a multi-site church, currently with six campuses in Kansas and Missouri. The Church Report named Hamilton's congregation the most influential mainline church in America, and he preached at the National Prayer Service as part of the presidential inauguration festivities in 2013. Hamilton is the best-selling and award-winning author of several books including The Call, 24 Hours That Changed the World, Seeing Gray in a World of Black and White, Prepare the Way, and Luke, all published by Abingdon Press.
