<u>Reflections from Annual Conference: Committed,</u> <u>Connected, Community</u>

Dear Members and Friends of the Foothills (and Hocking River) District:

After three years of virtual Annual Conference, we gathered in-person at the Dayton Convention Center for three power-packed days of worship, celebrations, teaching, reconnections, recommendations, and holy conferencing.

Sometimes, the conferencing was holier than it was at other times. There was laughter, singing, tears, frustration, rejoicing, silence.

Among the celebrations were inspiring worship services, spirit-filled preaching, joyous retirements, hope-filled commissioning, and majestic ordination. Several awards recognized intentional evangelism (DENMAN Award) or faithful discipleship (One Matters Award). These highlighted individuals or churches that took the mission of making disciples seriously. The Denman Award went to a lay person in the Dayton area. The One Matters Award (sponsored by Discipleship Ministries) was given to a church that went from zero baptisms and zero professions of faith to one, because each ONE Matters to God. This year, the One Matters Award was presented to Pastor Linda Ward and the Bremen UMC. Not only did they go from zero to one, they went from zero to eight and zero to 20! Praise God!

Other celebrations included those retiring after years of faithful service. Some of the retirees had been serving churches in the Foothills: Harold Benson, Jeff Belt, and Rick Bennington were all re-retiring! Sheryl Goble, Daniel Lamphier, Ruth Messick, Robert McDowell, Paul Wymer, John Kay, Ray Kane were Foothill retirees. Not all of those were recognized due to the timing of the Annual Conference and the retirement requests.

In addition to these dedicated servants, we witnessed the ordination of the class of Deacons and Elders, as well as the commissioning of the new Provisional Deacons and Elders. Among the Provisional Elders was Dan Wells, Pastor of Dresden UMC.

Throughout our days together the theme of Committed, Connected, Community resounded through preaching, teaching, and other presentations. We were encouraged to take heart in the midst of these challenging times and to remain resolute in our purpose and mission as Christ's followers who share the love of God with all people in all places.

And as is often the case with Annual Conference, there were moments of tension and division. For some, it was the final straw in a deeply divided environment. For others, it meant hope for better days ahead. For me, it was both encouraging and discouraging, hopeful and hurtful, uplifting and depressing. How can that be? It was a mix of so many significant issues that sometimes our emotions got the best of us. I, for one, long for the day when we can all put aside our differences (however important or petty they may appear) and focus on being the Church of Jesus Christ rather than drawing lines in the sand and wanting (or shall I say, expecting) others to choose sides. How broken our Lord's heart must be at times! And yet, we continue to hear these words and strive to live them out:

COMMITTED... CONNECTED... COMMUNITY.
