Jots From Jim...

I remember going to a new church and in the first six months I was called dictator, betrayer, evil, and foolish. Other than that, we got off to a pretty good start together. Mercy. The names we give and the names we receive speak volumes of who we are and who we want others to be.



Recently I got a new name. "Candy Man." It was said in reference to a recent mission trip I was taking to Cuba. Not knowing the reasons behind why I do what I

do in the mission field, this name basically implied that my approach to missions could be much-improved. Can I say it again? Mercy.

I take the name in stride and use it to make myself a better Christian. My "candy" is rice and beans. I have orchestrated the distribution of at least one-half million pounds of rice and beans over the years literally around the world. Did it change systemic poverty? No. Are people still hungry? Yes. Did it make any difference to the kingdom of God? The Candy Man believes it has made a world of difference.

Recently in Cuba we distributed rice to a community hit by a tornado, a high-risk maternity unit, fellow United Methodists in two communities, and several hard-working Cubans who do so much in helping others. A Cuban friend said something like, "You have made a difference today. God will send someone else tomorrow."

Maybe we dream too big. Maybe we over-reach in our efforts to bring about systemic change to so many problems in the world. Can we change things for the good with a little bit of candy for today? Maybe. We are called to be faithful with "TODAY" and allow ourselves to be used by God in God's "DAILY" plans. We are somebody's "tomorrow."

A great song by Sammy Davis, Jr. was "The Candy Man." A portion of the refrain had the words "The Candy Man can cause he mixes it with love and makes the world taste good." There's the key. If you mix it with love it will make the world a better place.

Bottom line? Find your candy. Mix it with love. Give it to the world. Jesus said, "Do you love me? If so, feed my sheep." He didn't call us to psycho-analyze sheep. He did not call us to alphabetize the flock by name and create systems to maximize self-grazing. The Good Lord simply said, "Feed my sheep." Sounds to me like the Candy Man might be a pretty good name after all.

Rev. Douglas J. Upton, 79, of Englewood, FL, passed away on February 18, 2024. He was born October 22, 1944 in Greenville, OH to parents Samuel & Celista (Folkerth) Upton. Growing up he was active in the EUB Church in Greenville. He graduated from Greenville High School in 1962 and graduated from Ohio Northern University in 1968 with a Bachelor of Arts in Music Education. He earned his Master of Divinity from United Theological Seminary, Dayton, OH, in 1992.

For 20 years he taught music in public schools in Ohio, including Ada, Pandora-Gilboa, and Lincolnview. He served four years as Executive Director of Youth for Christ of West Central Ohio and as Director of the Contemporaries music group. After attending seminary, he became an ordained minister of the United Methodist Church. Over the next 21 years, he served as pastor of the following Ohio churches: West Leipsic, Bethel, Mt. Victory, Ridgeway, and St. Paris. After retirement he served at Logansport (IN) Memorial Hospital as both a volunteer and chaplain. Over the years, he directed several church choirs and played in local bands. After moving to Florida four years ago, he and his wife, Julie attended and were members of Christ Venice Church. Throughout his life, he enjoyed playing his trumpet and using his musical abilities for the glory of God. Faith, family, and music were most important in his life.

Doug and his beloved wife, Julie, were high school sweethearts and were married for 58 ½ years. He was a wonderful husband, father, and grandfather. Bryan Stevenson of "Just Mercy" Leadership Clinic March 11 - Online

Bryan Stevenson, founder and Executive Director of the Equal Justice Initiative (EJI), a human rights organization will be the featured guest for Bishop Palmer's Leadership Clinic on March 11, 2024.

Under his leadership, EJI has won major legal challenges eliminating excessive and unfair

sentencing, exonerating innocent death row prisoners, confronting abuse of the incarcerated and the mentally ill, and aiding children prosecuted as adults. Mr. Stevenson has received over 50 honorary doctoral degrees and numerous awards.

He is the author of the critically acclaimed New York Times bestseller, Just Mercy, which was named by Time Magazine as one of the ten Best Books of the year. Just Mercy was adapted as a major motion picture. Mr. Stevenson is also the subject of the Emmy Award-winning HBO documentary True Justice. He is a graduate of the Harvard Law School and the Harvard School of Government.
