Beloved friends in Jesus and of Jesus:

As we turn the corner from March to April, and as we journey through Holy Week, the very week when Jesus our savior was arrested, labeled a criminal, crucified, and turn toward Easter and the power of resurrection, I hope you will join me in recognizing **National Second Chance month**. As United Methodists, we are called to the work of justice making, peace building, and the repairing of broken relationships. As a church, we have much work to do.

During my most recent Leadership Clinic with social justice and civil rights advocate Bryan Stevenson, we had church and a master class on Micah 6:8. Bryan gave us five practices for doing justice and loving mercy as citizens of God's kingdom:

- · Get proximate to those who are suffering.
- · Change narratives of fear and anger towards others.
- Tell the truth.
- · Be a people of hope.
- Do uncomfortable and inconvenient things.

Second Chance Month is about doing all of these as we embrace our justice-involved and sisters and brothers - some of whom are already members of our local congregations. I cannot think of a ministry that embodies and promotes these practices more than All In Community. I cannot travel anywhere in our Conference and not encounter a sister or brother who has a lived experience with the criminal justice system in their family.

I hope you and your congregation will join me in demonstrating that West Ohio United Methodists believe in and offer second chances just as Jesus did repeatedly in his ministry among us. I invite you to recognize **Second Chance Month** by declaring one Sunday in April **Second Chance Sunday** and emphasizing it in at least one of your April worship services.

By recognizing **Second Chance Sunday** you are saying to those burdened with marginalizing stigma and shame that we see and hear you. We want good things for you. We will help you rebuild your life. We want to be proximate to you on this journey. We love you.

Our All In Community leadership team has prepared resources to help you do this, including a video, bulletin insert and a fact sheet about the impact of incarceration in our mission field. You will find these resources <u>here</u>. Telling the truth about incarceration's impact in our larger social community and responding with compassion, hope and care bear witness to the power of Jesus' resurrection, and the hope it represents to us all. High Street UMC, Springfield, Expands Ministry to Unhoused Population

In 2021, Living Waters Ministry began its journey of serving the unhoused population in Springfield, Ohio. A ministry of High Street United Methodist Church in

the Western Lakes District, this outreach provides showers and, most recently, laundry service. It is an extension of the weekly community meals served at Central Community Center, housed at High Street UMC.

After seeing the unhoused living in a tent city day after day, the Rev. Cynthia Atwater saw a way to serve this population beyond feeding. "A shower is very basic," she said. "It's giving dignity, and that is free." Atwater began strategizing to create a ministry allowing attendees of the community meals to make an appointment to take a shower the following day. Later, the ministry began laundering shower clients' clothing.

High Street UMC, which will celebrate 175 years in ministry in April, serves about 150 people, mostly families, at their weekly community meal. The community meals provide a "meet-and-greet "opportunity. Some guests eat at the center, while others take their food with them. When they return for showers, the time presents an opportunity to have more intimate conversations to get to know the clients better.

Kairos Prison Ministry Is Celebrating Ministering To Inmates In The Ohio Reformatory For Women For Over 25 Years

Kairos Prison Ministry, an international nonprofit organization and leading prison ministry with over 30,000 volunteers announces that Kairos Ohio Reformatory for Women will be holding it's 55th Weekend in ORW, meaning that we have been serving right here in the community for over 25 years! Our 55th Kairos Inside Weekend will begin on April 18 and is a 3 ½ day Weekend that is entirely led by volunteers. It is often said that Kairos offers a front row seat to a miracle!

Hundreds of inmates throughout the years have participated in the 3 ½ day Weekend program which includes a series of talks, discussions, and prayer that creates or continues a desire for spiritual growth. This has enabled Kairos to establish a Christian community inside the prison by bringing the love and forgiveness of Jesus Christ to those in darkness. This has resulted in an improved prison living environment, reduced recidivism, a safer community, and countless healed families.

Kairos achieves this impact by being the ministry that keeps coming back through Continuing Ministry. We go back into ORW for Prayer and Share groups as well as monthly Reunions.

There are many ways the Central Ohio community can get involved in this and future Kairos Weekends, of which there are generally two per year. Ways to get involved include joining the team that goes into ORW, as part of the support team, baking Kairos Cookies that are given to participants, creating agape (letters, posters, placemats, banners, prayer chains) which are physical representations of love, prayer vigil participation, and through financial support as each Kairos Weekend is funded by donations and grants.
