## The West Ohio Conference special called Annual Conference

## - Saturday, October 28, 2023

Paragraph 603.5 of The 2016 Book of Discipline of The United Methodist Church outlines the provisions by which a Special Session of the Annual Conference may be called "by the bishop with concurrence of three-fourths of the district superintendents."

#### From Bishop Palmer -

Having the unanimous concurrence of the district superintendents, I am calling a Special Session of the West Ohio Annual Conference on Saturday, October 28, 2023, at 9:00 am at Ginghamsburg United Methodist Church, Tipp City, Ohio, for the following purposes:

- $\cdot$  To act on the requests of churches to disaffiliate under the provisions of paragraph 2553 of The Book of Discipline.
- To approve the 2024 West Ohio Conference Budget.
- To receive a report and act on any recommendation(s) from the Transformative Discipleship Lead Team (Connectional Ministries) and the Board of Trustees of the Annual Conference regarding West Ohio Camps.
- Elections to fill vacancies in the delegations to Jurisdictional Conference.

Clergy and Lay Members who were elected as representatives for the June 2023 Annual Conference remain members for the October special called Annual Conference.

Registration for this special Annual Conference will end on October 1st, and all clergy members, lay members and guests must register.

Because electronic voting devices will be used and we must order those ahead of Annual Conference, pre-registration will be required so that we can ensure we have enough voting devices available. You must pre-register in order to vote at Annual Conference. Only those that register will receive devices to vote.

# The Fresh Starts <Evangelism> Exchange entitled "Evangelism in the Augmented Age" is on September 19<sup>th</sup> @ Mason UMC in Mason, OH

The Church's practical theology is currently being lived out within three distinct cultural expressions: Industrial Age, Information Age, and the emerging Augmented Age. Most of our churches gather within Industrial Age thinking—putting money in offering plates, registering worship attendance on a pew pad or registration card, or phone tree reminders for upcoming events. Fewer of our churches are living into Information Age thinking—

online giving, QR codes for worship attendance, and texting or email services to share programmatic information. Fewer still are adopting the current cultural reality of the Augmented Age—auto draft from digital currency gains, geofencing campuses, or intuitive devotion technology.

In this fun, interactive Fresh Starts Exchange, Matt Rawle will both detail why living into the Augmented Age is important for our communities of faith and offer practical and

innovative steps to sharing Jesus within a new, emerging culture. It is only one session lasting from 10am – 3pm. Lunch will be provided by the Cristian Family Credit Union.

Bio: Rev. Matt Rawle is the Lead Pastor at Asbury United Methodist Church in Bossier City, Louisiana and a graduate from the LSU School of Music and Duke Divinity School. He is an international speaker who loves to tell an old story in a new way, especially at the intersection of pop culture and the church. ## **An Opportunity to Practice our Social Principles in Reentry**

You are invited to become part of an Ohio United Methodist social holiness collaborative effort to "Do all the good you can, by all the means you can, in all the ways you can, in all the places you can, at all the times you can, to all the people you can, as long as ever you can." Leaders of All In Community, West Ohio Conference's justice-involved ministry, invite you to a special meeting on **Tuesday, September 26, at 11:30AM – 12:30PM** to learn about a grant opportunity that puts our social principles into practice across Ohio. This opportunity invites us to act as conveners, collaborators, and connectors for coalition-building around support for men, women and their families upon their return home from an incarceration experience.

As United Methodists, we are called to "support the basic rights of all persons to equal access to housing, education, communication, employment, medical care, legal redress for grievances, and physical protection." (The Social Community, 162.III)

Does this include people who have been incarcerated, their families, and their victims? **YES**, it does.

Our social holiness also encompasses "a responsibility to innovate, sponsor, and evaluate new forms of community that will encourage development of the fullest potential in individuals....We therefore support social climates in which human communities are maintained and strengthened for the sake of all persons and their growth." (The Nurturing Community, 161.II)

Does this responsibility extend to our neighbors and loved ones who have been incarcerated, their families, and their victims? **YES**, it does.


We know what happens when we do not act to create continuums of care in our communities for those returning following an incarceration experience. Increased violence, decreased safety, increased basic human needs, decreased human dignity, disenfranchisement, and discrimination are just a few of the social ills we all witness and experience.

The Good News is that we can change the landscape and create genuine reentry continuums of care when we collaborate and co-labor with others in our community.

## **Unclaimed Funds Found for United Methodist Churches**

Did you know you can conduct a free search through <a href="https://www.missingmoney.com/app/claim-search">https://www.missingmoney.com/app/claim-search</a> to see if your church has any outstanding unclaimed funds? This service is linked directly to the Ohio Department of Commerce Division of Unclaimed Funds and the entire process is free.

Our search of "UMC" uncovered nearly 50 Ohio United Methodist Churches with unclaimed funds. When searching, try using varied parameters i.e., church name with UMC or church name with United Methodist. Or try just UMC. Also, select Ohio to narrow down the results.

If a claim is found, a one-page application is required along with documentation. You will receive instructions on what documents are needed to prove the claim is valid i.e., photo ID, Tax ID, proof of address etc. Their toll-free number is listed on the instructions if you have questions. Once complete, send the application and pertinent documents by mail directly to the Ohio Department of Commerce.

You may receive a request for additional information. Please be patient, as they hold the burden of ensuring they release funds to the correct person/s. If the claim is approved, you will receive a check by mail.

Don't miss this opportunity to receive funds that are due to your church.

## **Hospitality Tips for the 21st Century**

Many of us sit in the church sanctuary on Sunday mornings with an eye turned toward the door, hoping that new visitors will enter. This might not happen as frequently as we'd like.

"To really be hospitable to our neighbors who aren't connected to the church, and probably never will be in its current form, we need to figure out how to create pockets of hospitality to be more inclusive and connect with more people," says The Rev.
