Genesis 5:24 - And Enoch, walked with God and he was not, for the Lord took him,...

The word "walk" is the biblical expression for "fellowship and obedience with God that results in divine favor." It refers to the manner of a person living in nearness to God. It is a live style of dedication and devotion. Enoch's walk lived up to the meaning of his name...Enoch means "Dedicated."

Genesis 6:8; 22; 7:1 - Noah found grace in the eyes of the Lord...

Noah was a just man, perfect (righteous, practice and attitude/lifestyle of obedience) in his generations. Noah walked with God. *Noah did according to all that God commanded him*; ...God said to him, I have seen that you are righteous before Me in this generation.

Genesis 17:1 – When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the Lord appeared to him and said..."I am the Lord Almighty God; walk before Me and be blameless.

Deuteronomy – 10:12-22...what does the Lord require of you...but to fear the Lord...walk in all His ways...to love Him...to serve Him with all your heart and soul...to keep the commandments and His statues...for your good.

You've heard about Fresh Expressions popping up all across West Ohio. Here is your chance to explore how fresh expressions could revitalize your church and reach people in your community. Is God stirring something new within you? Fresh Expressions are an

effective way to build relationships, serve the people within your context and community, and revitalize your church.

Fresh Expressions are about going outside of the norm, going beyond the typical boundaries of ordinary church to build human community with and among people with whom the church has forgotten, ignored, marginalized, or dismissed.

Discover FX is a 5-hour immersion into what Fresh Expressions are and how to launch your own expression of church. After the training, optional coaching sessions will be available via zoom to walk with you through launching a fresh expression of church.

Discover what FX can do for your church in a convenient location in your district and learn from your colleagues who are already doing Fresh Expressions in your region.

Training is from 9:30am - 2:30pm and lunch is included. Cost is \$50/person or \$25/per team member (Pastor + at least one layperson is recommended) (assistance available if needed)

LAKESIDE INSTITUTE July 21-27, 2024

Lakeside Institute is a camp like no other. Located inside the gates of the Lakeside Chautauqua community, Lakeside Institute has been helping youth and young adults, ages 14 through age 20, further their personal faith journeys for over 100 years!

Through daily messages, small group conversations, large & small group activities, devotionals and worship opportunities, each youth is encouraged to develop their individual relationship with Christ. Supported by adult volunteers, the camp Chaplain and their peers, for them to explore their percent faith beliefs. deepen their

Lakeside Institute provides a place for them to explore their personal faith beliefs, deepen their understanding of God's work in the world, ask questions, and prepare for a lifelong journey of faith.

The theme for camp this summer is "Finding the ME in the WE." Using Luke 1:28 and the story of Mary as an entry point, youth will explore what it means to claim their God given identity, while also remaining deeply connected to the larger community where they have been called.

While Lakeside Institute runs through East Ohio Conference, there is a long history of involvement from West Ohio as well. Hilliard UMC has several leaders on staff, including one of the deans (April Andrick) and this year's chaplain (Rev. April Blaine). The leadership works to create an accommodating and inclusive environment for all young people, including LGBTQIA+ youth.

Campers stay in Wo-Ho-Mis and nearby cabins on the grounds of Lakeside. Youth are welcome to come on their own, or with others from their church. Come and join the fun at Lakeside Institute this summer!

CONFERENCE ARCHIVES MOVING TO MTSO

The archives of the East and West Ohio conferences will be moving to the Methodist Theological School in Ohio (MTSO) this summer.

For more than 50 years, the archives were housed at Ohio Wesleyan University (OWU). Last year, OWU notified the conferences that the Beeghly Library was closing for renovations and that relocation of the archives would be necessary.

"We are grateful to Ohio Wesleyan for caring for our archives for all these years, and we look forward to

working with MTSO. The United Methodist Church has a rich history, and our archives are about cultivating our past to help engage our future," said Dave Boling, West Ohio Conference Archives and History Chairperson.

It is anticipated that the materials will be moved to MTSO in June. Once the archives are relocated to MTSO, attention will turn to accessibility and use of the archives.
