General Conference begins April 23

The United Methodist Church General Conference is set to begin on April 23 in Charlotte, NC. This conference takes place every four years and is the only entity that speaks for the denomination. The United Methodist Book of Discipline is updated every four years to incorporate changes made by the General Conference.




The voting delegates for this conference will come from various parts of the world, including the United States (55.9%), Africa (32%), the Philippines (6%), Europe (4.6%), and concordat churches that have close ties to The United Methodist Church (1.5%). Half of the delegates will be clergy and the other half will be laity.

The series features three separate hour-long videos that each tackle a different time span, starting from Cincinnati's birth and bringing us to the present day. Each viewing is followed by a facilitated discussion session.


Learn about Creation Care during Earth Day Connect A-Round Table - April 22

On Earth Day from 5:30-6:30pm, you are invited to Connect A-Round Table for a virtual conversation on creation care.


